#### Call to Confession

In our fast-food, drive-thru, one-day-Amazon-delivery world, patience is a lost art. Our "patience muscle" is one we don't like to exercise often. Yet as Christians, we're called upon to use that muscle. God desires for us to wait steadfastly upon Him and be longsuffering with each other. "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience" (Colossians 3:12).

Patience is something God requires, but something He also understands.

# FAITH PROMISE Update from Don Slager

Don arrived safely in Liberia on June 3 and then traveled from the airport to Monrovia, Liberia. He spent several days working with the Maan translators. They were able to finish the book of Numbers and start the book of Deuteronomy.

On Monday, June 13, the 3 Dan translators made it to Monrovia and they have been working on the book of Proverbs. The checking goes slow because the city power is not reliable and therefore the internet is poor and the air conditioners do not work. They also need to be very careful with the translations to ensure that the translations have the same meaning as the text in the Bible.

Don has been approached many times on the street with people asking for money for food or medical help. Continue to pray for Don and the translators as they continue this work
