Announcements:

The imagery of the angel banner is purposefully obscured to invite the viewer into its story. It is inspired by George Herbert's 1633 poem, "Easter Wings" which Pastor Laura used for a sermon. As you view it ask yourself, "Do I see myself lifted by Christ as I "imp my wing on thine?" (The verb "to imp" refers to the falconry practice of grafting flight feathers from one bird into the wing of another to help it fly better.) Or is it a dove symbolizing the power of the Holy Spirit? Or an angel heralding Christ's victory?" The banner is composed of doilies donated by the congregation; wedding-dress lace; and over 100 prayer "feathers" written by the congregation tucked (imped) into the wings. Machelle Knochenhauer designed it and had construction help from Agnes Fisher.
