Council Nominations:

It is time to seek nominations for Council and Care Teams, for service beginning on July 1. You may nominate yourself or you may nominate someone else. As a reminder, our Council is comprised of the Leadership Board, Connection Board, and Care Board. The various Board members are elected as part of Council. The Care Teams are made up of one elected elder plus two volunteers (non-elected) for each district. We will have openings on all three Boards this year, as well as for Care Team Volunteers.

Why nomination?

God has gifted each of us with unique talents and skills. Service is an honor and a calling. God requires us to exercise stewardship over the talents that He has entrusted to us. We invite you to nominate yourself for the role(s) you feel confident filling. We also invite you to nominate someone else who has the character and qualities best suited to serve and lead in a role.

What should you do next?

From now until March 5:

• Consider nominating at least one other person who you believe would be qualified for a particular position.

• Women should embrace the opportunity to serve. Our church leadership will be most effective when it reflects our membership. The unique gifts of women and men complement each other, and both are necessary for effective governance of the church.

- Couples with both interest and skill are invited to serve together, especially in Care Teams.
- You can nominate yourself or someone else for more than one role.

How can I submit a nomination, either for myself or for someone else?

Complete a paper form and return it to the office. The form is available in the church office and in the weekly e-newsletter. Nominations are due on Sunday, March 5.
