Full Council Updates:

November Meeting Recap ~The Full Council approved a new process for the recruitment, selection and equipping of office bearers (see below). Council also received a status update on the implementation of our new membership management software, called Planning Center. One of the more exciting features of this new package is the ability to view an online church directory, which should be available in the first quarter of 2024. We are also planning a council and staff retreat for February 2 and 3.

Elder and Deacon Selection ~The Full Council has approved a new process for office bearer selection. This process focuses on clear communication of roles and responsibilities, intentional review of nominees and their gifts and passions for those roles, strategic selection of candidates by the council based on natural abilities and interests and the council's needs; and will culminate in a congregational vote for each nominee and, when possible, one alternate for each vacancy. Elected office bearers will be trained and mentored throughout their term. More information on this new process will be shared in a town-hall meeting after church sometime in January. In the meantime, please prayerfully consider if God is calling you or someone you know to serve in this way.

Advent Devotional: This holiday season, we will be sending you an Advent devotional every Friday in the e-newsletter. You will find included one scripture reading for each day of the week, along with an Advent reflection and a song. We hope that these resources enhance your experience of the most wonderful time of the year.
